

1. The Diocese of Moshi is one of the main providers of Education in the Kilimanjaro region, managing Nursery, Primary, Secondary, High Schools and Vocational Training Centres,

but it has observed a great need of schools for disabled children at Secondary level.

Therefore it has proposed to build St. Pammachius Inclusive Secondary School for regular and disabled children .

1. As a rule, disabled children are kept separate from regular children – their condition is considered a misfortune even by their parents. They are vulnerable to physical abuse. False beliefs are still rampant, and HIV/AIDS is on the increase among this group.

2. LAND:

The Diocese has allocated 12 acres for school use only.

FUNDS:

Donors are needed to build it in phases.

TEACHERS

provided by the Ministry from two Teacher Training Colleges.

3. Construction in phases : as soon as basic structures are in place, children will be enrolled, and as each classroom is completed more children can be enrolled.

KTTC, Katanga Technical Training College (one of Father Maningi's projects) will make the furniture.

We need desks and chairs for the students and tables and chairs for the teachers. The cost is approximately £6,000 and this is the part of the project Father Maningi is hoping will be accepted by Christ Church.

We can be assured that our donations go straight to the project. The whole project is challenging but we are just part of it, i.e. the furniture.

With Father Paul's blessing and Father Maningi's wholehearted agreement, the last donation of £1,773.27 has become the first instalment for the school furniture.

Father Maningi is coming in 2012 but a date is yet to be fixed.
